a	An "ah" as in the English word "apple".	ll	No English equivalent. Made by putting tip of tongue on roof of mouth and blowing.
b	Like an English b .	m	Like an English m .
c	Always hard as in the English word "cat", NEVER soft as in "cease".	n	Like an English n .
ch	Like the Scottish ch as in "loch", NEVER as in the English word "choice".	o	Long o as in the English word "go".
d	Like an English d .	p	Like an English p .
dd	Voiced <i>th</i> as in the English word "breathe".	ph	Same ph as in the English word "phone".
e	The sound as in the English word "breath".	r	Trilled r .
f	Like an English v .	rh	No English equivalent. Made by blowing while trilling an r .
ff	Like an English f .	s	Always soft as in the English word "sat", NEVER as in "advise".
g	Hard g as in the English word "get".	t	Like an English t .
ng	Sound as in the English word "longer".	th	Unvoiced th as in the English word "wreath".
h	An h as in the English word "have".	u	A long e as in the English word "tea".
i	Long e as in the English word "meet".	w	An oo as in the English word "broom"; or an English w as in "work" when used as a consonant.
l	Like an English l .	y	Like uh as in the English word "come"; or (at end of words) long e as in "family".
